### **Course-Level Objectives**

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Classify the elements of entrepreneurship and entrepreneurial processes

2. Identify opportunities for expanding patient-centered services in the pharmacy setting using point-of-care (POC) testing

- 3. Discuss collecting patient reported symptoms, medical history, and medication allergies using the Pharmacist Patient Care Process (PPCP)
- 4. Describe physical assessments, when appropriate to patient care, which may include but are not limited to vital signs and statistics: blood pressure, pulse, respiratory rate, oxygenation, cervical lymph node inspection, body temperature, throat exam, and skin assessment
- 5. Describe and perform the following specimen collections used in point-of-care testing: throat swab, nasal swab, and finger stick blood collection
- 6. Identify patients who should receive testing and treatment for minor, nonchronic conditions and uncomplicated infections
- 7. Recognize "red flags" to treatment indicating more severe illness and appropriate actions such as when to refer to other healthcare provider
- 8. Apply concepts to patient-specific cases focusing on influenza, streptococcus, and other minor infections
- 9. Discuss strategies and techniques for writing and entering into a successful point-of-care protocol agreement
- 10. Develop policies and procedures for a CLIA-waived laboratory practice site
